



Library Facts

- Carnegie Foundation bought the Queen Street site for \$600 and opened the library in 1912 at a cost of \$25,000.
- As part of municipal amalgamation, Garden Hill joined the Port Hope Public Library in 2001.
- With the reopening in 2002 after a renovation and expansion, Port Hope boasted a 17% increase in membership, 40% increase in circulation and a 55% increase in computer use.
- The rural library service was moved in 2018 from Garden Hill to the Port Hope Community Hub in Canton.

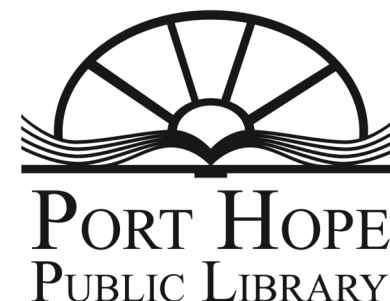

- **Community Volunteer Opportunity**



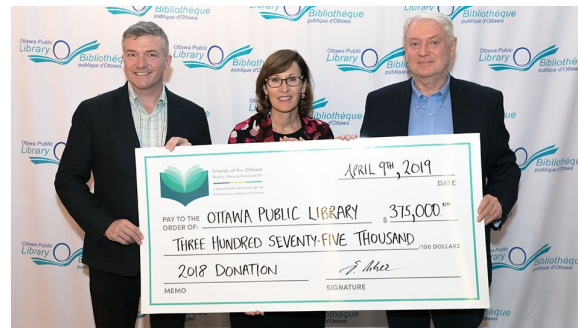
Being a "friend" today supports the original criteria required for securing a Carnegie grant for the Port Hope Public Library back in the 1900s:

Friends Across Canada

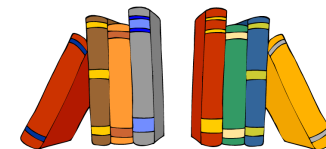


- Friends of the Library in Ottawa donated \$375,000 in 2018 through a campaign that included developing and publishing a youth literature anthology to be sold to raise funds.



- Friends of the Mississauga Library System offers a "Library Education Award" to support Mississauga residents who are pursuing a career in Library and Information Science.

- The Calgary Friends operate a store that sells merchandise as well as books.



- Peterborough Friends of the Library runs a semi-annual book sale. Over \$10,000 was raised at their sale in March 2019.

- Oshawa FOL partners with CINEFEST DURHAM to screen TIFF movies in support of special projects at the library.



- Belleville's FOL group has raised over \$250,000 since 1997 for equipment and collections.
